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CanSail

CanSail 1-2 are the two beginner levels where the basics of sailing are taught. These levels focus on boat handling, safety lessons, and basic sailing theory.

This week we learned:

- Points of sail
- Parts of the boat
- Steering
- How to trim our sails
- How to right a capsized boat!
- Knot tying
- Starting and Stopping our boats
- How to rig and derig (preparing) our hoats
- Hypothermia and heat exhaustion symptoms, and how to dress properly for sailing in various weather conditions
- Tacking and Gybing
- Hazards of the Charlottetown Harbour
- Starboard & Port
- Right of way








CanSail 3-4/Intermediate

CanSail 3-4 is a level group which is where the true meat of technical sailing is learned. These levels are the transition between beginning sailing skills and heavy racing. All further levels build on skills initially learned in the 3-4 levels.

This week we learned:

- Tuning our boats with rake and tension settings
- Keeping proper heel/flat boat in heavy air
- Steering, sheeting, and body positioning in the 420
- Spinnaker and trapeze
- Introduction to racing
 - o Starts and mark roundings
- Sail controls
- Wind shifts: adjusting to wind shifts and recognizing when a wind shift occurs
- Reading ticklers and sailing at upwind angles that are racing appropriate
- Log book writing to track individual progress and selfimprovement









The CanSail 3-6 race training group is focused on learning technical skills used for racing dinghies. These lessons build on sailing skills already learned to make them as fast and efficient as possible. This week we focused on:

- Surfing on waves
 - For this lesson, we sailed out of the Harbour into the Northumberland Strait!
- Keelboat sailing as a break from dinghy training (courtesy of John Hayden)
- Starts and accelerations
- Mark roundings
- Sail controls and fine adjustments for points of sail, gusts, and lulls
- Heavy wind sailing

ARK Regatta

This past weekend we had sailors compete at the ARK regatta in Bedford, Nova Scotia! We had 4 lasers, 2 optis, and 1 420. Big shoutout to all parents who supported this event and helped load boats onto trailers as well as tow boats to and from the event!
